

The magic of the white nights: a cruise through the Baltic Sea

On a night-time stroll through the illuminated alleyways, you feel like you've been transported back in time.

The cruise from June 9 to 14, 2026 from/to Kiel through this enchanting region is not only a journey to fascinating places, but also a journey into the heart of a Nordic summer that will remain in your memory forever.
